'Femi' has program for safer winter roads

Saying he has a special interest in Town of Farragut as a resident along Choto Road, Dr. Olufemi "Femi" Omitaomu decided to make a study of Town roads and streets for

his "Precision De-Icing Technique" program.

"We just did it on our own," Omitaomu, an Oak Ridge National Laboratory research scientist, said of his desire to inquire about the slope and amount of sunlight absorbed for each 50-meter stretch of a given Town street or road.

The bottom line is creating a more efficient way snow and ice treatments, such as salt, are spread — both for easier and quicker traffic passage and, more importantly, to decrease accidents. "This is going to save money, and most importantly it's going to save lives," he said.

"The system has been tested under laboratory settings," Omitaomu added. "The next step is to put the control system on a snow truck for field testing before we can say it is ready for prime time."

When ready, this ORNL program

would be available, free of charge, to any municipality looking to improve its snow and ice prevention and removal, he said. "It started with the snow event we had in Knoxville a couple of years ago, where that

Santa letters HQ 'staffed' by biz, Town, FHS

Because his North Pole elves are working fast and furiously toward the Christmas Eve deadline, Santa has personally selected a very special group of surrogates to help him answer children's letters this holiday season.

Volunteers from CH Interiors & Gifts, along with Town of Farragut staff and several Farragut High School students, have been responding to letters dropped off at the new Santa's Mailbox in Founder's Park at Campbell Station.

The mailbox was unveiled during the Nov. 27 Lighting of the Park ceremony, and organizers determined early on they could respond to Santa's personal request for assistance.

"[CH Interiors] was the guiding force [for the project]," said Sue Stuhl, Parks & Leisure Services director who is overseeing the Town's participation.

Jesse Boling, owner of the business, said the Town offered to help — and the project was a go.

He said the collaboration has been a good one, and has ensured letters are being answered as quickly as possible.

A representative from the Town's Public Works Department collects the letters daily, decked out in an Elf hat and carrying one of Santa's official Christmas sacks.

The letters are delivered to Town Hall, and volunteers go to work, responding to each one that has included a return ad-

"Santa can't answer letters that don't have a return address," said Stuhl, who estimated the Town received 75 to 80 letters the first week, while Boling estimated his store had received around 100 during that same time frame.

That number is increasing quickly, with upward of 25 to 50 letters being collected daily.

For all letters to be received in a timely

\$136k tax fee again fought

One way to offset Town of Farragut's reduced amount of Hall Income Tax revenue, according to Knox County Commissioner John Schoonmaker, is getting relief from the Sales Tax Administra-

tion Fee.

"That's what [state] Department of Revenue charges the City of Knoxville, Knox County and the Town of

Farragut to get their sales tax returned to them," Schoonmaker, representing 5th District that includes Farragut and Concord, said during an annual meeting of local and state leaders. "Rep. [Jason] Zachary introduced a bill last year [to eliminate the

fee] but it was exclusively for Knox Coun-That didn't g_0 forward."

Schoonmaker and Zachary, [R-District 14 including

Farragut and Concord], attended the annual meeting of Commissioners, Knox County Board of Education representatives and local state elected officials at Dead End BBQ, Sutherland Avenue, in the morning and early afternoon Thursday, Dec. 7.

"Now we're going to go statewide with it and make it for all the counties and municipalities," Schoonmaker said.

To abolish the administrative fee "is the right thing to do," he added. "The City of Knoxville loses \$1.7 million [annually]

actually happened back-to-back," Omitaomu said. "Schools were out for about two weeks.

"That was what prompted our motivation ...," he added. "We then did a quick study and we found that usually the way the icy roads are cleared is based on a very old idea where they use traffic volume."

Defining the biggest priority roads for first treatment as level 1 roads, based on traffic volume, Omitaomu said, "Because [road crews] start with level 1 roads, they don't usually get to de-ice level 2 and level 3 [less priority] roads. And because of that people normally were not able to get out of their neighborhoods to get on the Interstate.

"One of the issues is a resource allocation issue because they don't have a sufficient budget to buy road salt to salt everywhere," he added, "So they have to prioritize where they need to apply brine or salt.

"I've noticed that in the Town of Farragut as well. The major roads are usually treated first, but the neighborhoods are not treated, either because they don't have enough resources or because they run out of resources."

However, Town administrator David Smoak said, "We've got a little over 200 tons of salt in our bins ready to go. We can handle several weather events before we would need to go and get additional supplies."

Their snow removal fleet is two dump trucks with plows, and two Ford F-250 pickup trucks with spreaders, Smoak said.

About any possible changes, Smoak said, "The Town strives to maintain an efficient and effective snow removal strategy based on the many variables that go into each winter weather event, and would welcome the opportunity to discuss how to enhance this service to our community with Dr. Omitaomu."

"Now that the story is out, we are looking for the appropriate contact names so that we can shoot them some of these results and get their comment," Omitaomu said.

Board of Mayor and Aldermen is scheduled to vote on releasing the Town's "Snow Removal Schedule" for the 2017-18 winter season during its meeting starting at 7 p.m., tonight, Thursday, Dec. 14.

While Omitaomu was not critical of Public Works personnel, Smoak specifically praised the Town's Pub-



lic Works crew, led by long-time director Bud McKelvey. "Bud and his guys over at Public Works do a great job of keeping our roads clear during snow events," Smoak said.

Having contacted City of Knoxville, Omitaomu said, "They actually provided some information to validate some of our results. ... We discovered that some of the trouble spots that they have identified over the years actually correlate with ... our model."

Chad Weth, Public Service director for City of Knoxville, said, "There is not a plan currently to implement this system. While it is very interesting and we do plan on looking at the results, there are many steps that would need to be made for implementation.

"Currently our systems are all gravity-fed and when the chute is open, salt is applied evenly on every stretch of roadway. This system would help us define areas that need more/less salt or no salt at all."

About his model, Omitaomu said, "We had to develop a method to classify road segments, every 50 meters, whether it should be treated or not treated. To do that we have to account for whether that segment is blocked from sunlight by trees or a structure, and whether it is a sloped road or a flat road.

"One formulation calculates the amount of solar radiation on a road segment while accounting for possible cloud cover. We used historical cloud cover profile for this area to determine a range," he added.

"The other formulation is based on the thermodynamics of snowmelt, which accounts for several parameters including days since last snowfall, albedo of the snow, wind speed, air temperature, freezing temperature, dewpoint temperature and rainfall."

With all data evaluated, Omitaomu said, "Once we come up with that we can easily integrate that information into GPS, so that we can then put that into snow trucks. When the snow trucks are going on the roads, using the GPS location, the truck automatically and intelligently determines whether that segment should be salted or not."

As for contacting Tennessee Department of Transportation about the project, he said, "We are yet to contact TDOT. We plan to do that after the holidays."

Omitaomu and his project team "of about seven" includes Farragut residents Daniel Koch, a research scientist, and Budhendra Bhaduri, a corporate fellow.

on this fee. Knox County loses \$525,000 and the Town of Farragut loses \$140,000 a year" because of the fee.

"Total sales tax for Farragut [for 2016-17 fiscal year] is \$12,165,032. That number is less the administrative fee, which at 1.125 percent is \$136.856.61. stated a press release from David Smoak, Town of Farragut administrator.

"The Town gets half of that total sales tax [minus the fee], which is \$6,082,516. The other half goes to Knox County Schools," Smoak further stated.

"So it would be more accurate to say that, if the fee was discontinued, the Town and Knox County Schools would gain

\$136,856.61."

Zachary "is going to carry the bill into the [state] House of Representatives, and I'm sure [state] Sen. [Richard] Briggs [R-District 7 including Farragut] is going to do the same in the Senate," Schoonmaker said about the upcoming General Assembly session. "[Briggs] supported us last year on this."

"Last year it failed just because it was a Knox County application," Zachary said. "When you look at it as a statewide application, the counties and the municipalities are paying \$30 million a year to simply get their tax dollars back that we submit to the state — and that's a problem.

"Commissioner Schoonmaker has done a fantastic job of creating an awareness among the

county commissioners statewide," he added. "And it's our job to do that with legislators, to let people know that we've reached a point now where [it is unlike] back in the '80s, where [the fee] was feasible because there was more overhead involved.

"Now the [fee] process is so electronic, the overhead and the requirements are not there. So you're got \$30 million in county and municipality dollars staying with the state as a fee."

In terms of a possible legislative compromise, Zachary said, "Possibly looking at the [fee elimination] as a phase-out as we did with Hall Income Tax.

"We want to do all we can to alleviate some of the budget challenges with the municipalities and the counties," he added.



When to begin drawing Social Security?

Question: I am 65 years old, married and want to retire next year. I'm trying to decide if I should take my Social Security next year or wait until I'm 70 and live on my investments until then. How do

Answer: The time between retirement and age

70 is the sweet spot for retirement tax planning. One strategy is to delay SS until age 70 (thus growing 8 percent/year) and live on your 401k dollars. This assumes you'll be in a lower tax bracket before age 70. Because there are several factors to weigh, this is a part of retirement planning that needs professional guidance.

with a form of dementia, and I don't know what to do next.

Answer: The next step is to get your finances organized using an online tool like Everplans or a hard copy binder. You'll know what assets and insurance you have, and can make a plan to pay for his care. You'll also need a financial power of attorney that allows you to manage his financial affairs. And just as importantly, make sure you have a plan for yourself in case your assets are drained paying for his care.

Question: My parents paid for a long-term care policy and never used it. I know I should be thinking about one for myself, but it's hard to pay that premium never knowing if I'll even use it.

Answer: I hear you. But yet health costs not covered by Medicare are the biggest unknown expense we face in retirement.

Consider an asset-based LTC policy, where you fund it as an investment and get a multiplied amount of your investment as tax-free LTC benefits if you do need care, and a tax-free death benefit for your heirs if you





"This community doesn't real-




ize that there are very few, if any, grand masters that are actually instructors," McKeehan said.

Lenoir City may not be the western frontier,

but right now for Carson Farmer it's the next best thing. The 2015 Farragut High School graduate

practices daily on the family's pastureland, honing the rodeo roping skills he hopes will lead him to compete at Frontier Days in Cheyenne, Wyoming, next summer.

"That is the granddaddy of them all," he said of the competition. "Cheyenne would be a dream come true, just to ride [in that arena].

"I don't care if I rope a single cow, it would just be an honor to be there."

The goal is more than achievable. After three years on the amateur rodeo circuit, he is finally pursuing the next level of the sport, and recently received his "pro card."

"You have to be 18 to get it," he said. "And it is only a permit until you win \$1,000, then it becomes your card."

Farmer estimated if he just places at two upcoming rodeos, he will be able to qualify. He participated in three pro rodeos earlier this year, and won his first competitive saddle in Franklin.

Step by step, he is following what he hopes will be a life-long career path.



"It is the most addictive thing in the world," Farmer said.

He said realizing there was money to be made in the sport was just icing on the cake. "I have always been competi-

tive," Farmer said. "My cousin has always roped, and one year he made \$36,000 about 20 years

"That really got my interest, to know you could do that for a liv-

Farmer took up riding as a sophomore, after becoming "burned out" following eight years of football play.

"My dad told me to find another sport, or to get a job," he said.

His sights then turned to horses. The animals and the rodeo sport was already familiar to him, as his uncle, Ed Farmer, has long been on the pro rodeo circuit as a steer roper.

Farmer's father, Joel, who also

ropes and rides, insisted Carson take care of a horse before buying him one of his own.

The family then lived off Union Road, and Carson found a mildly neglected local horse that he began to visit and groom. "My dad told me it would be a

year before I got my own horse, but it was probably just six or seven months before I got one," he said. Ed Farmer, who lives in Geor-

gia, found Carson's first horse, and the FHS alumnus said he spent every Saturday, driving to his uncle's home to train.

Of all the events in competitive rodeo — including barrel racing, saddle and bareback bronco riding and bull riding — Farmer's choice has always been calf roping and team roping.

He said the sport is not hard, but there is a certain strategy and requires a lot of practice time.

His family, which also includes his mother, Angela, supported Carson's passion so much that

they moved to an expansive property in Lenoir City four years ago so he could train regularly and freely. Farmer estimates he ropes at least 200 times a day, using either real calves or a "dummy"

calf he has on site. Farmer primarily rides 13-yearold "Yeller," a horse he has had for three years that he "wouldn't give up" even though he has had

several offers.

He and his father practice and ride together, and sometimes compete in team roping events. Earlier this year, they came in 10th out of 352 teams.

Farmer hopes to give professional rodeo a real chance after he completes his sociology course at Pellissippi State Community College. "I would at least like to find a job in the western industry," he said.

"To be able to compete is the most fun thing," Farmer added. "And to win money, doing something you love, there is really nothing like it."


